## Little Children, It is the Last Time, Wherefore

Good morning, everyone! I am particularly excited this morning for a couple of reasons. One, after last week's message, my oldest son informed me that I was mistaken - and he has never told me not to tell jokes - or try to tell jokes. Even though he is the main comedian in the family, he said he has never been in a participant in the forbidden joke telling that has come from my other family members.

I also heard from Jeff telling me that I actually made him laugh out loud with my opening comments last week. So - that is just great! A milestone for me that could also be a stepping stone - which could lead to a whole new adventure in my otherwise dull life.

Here goes, joke number 1.

A thief broke into our house again this past week and said he knew we had some money and he demanded that I give it to him. So, I got up and started helping him look for it.

Yeah, yeah, that was probably kind of stupid - but it's kind of based on real life. Here's the absolute truth. I am not rich. I have very little money. Because I believe the Bible teaches against being in debt - I don't have any. Each month, I pay for 3 cell phones - which are pre-paid, anonymous plans - they have to be because I do not have a social security number which they require for regular phone plans. I pay an Internet bill. And I have a very small electric bill because years ago, I learned about solar panels and I put them up - so that I have a very small electric bill.

I have to provide food for my wife and daughter. We have an Aldi's that my wife shops at - so our food bill is very small.

Imagine with me please - trying to live in the land of America - as I have for all my life and trying to eke out a living without a social security number. Do you really think a man can get rich that way? Think of all the difficulties that this presents. No bank account. No driver's licenses. No business licenses. Yet - certain people that we live nearby to - have told others that quote "this man makes hundreds of thousands of dollars a month, and doesn't pay taxes."

Another truth - the reality is - that back in 1987 - I wrote my first book. It was called,

"Paper Money, the Destruction of a Nation." I wrote this book during a very brief time in my life where I thought the U.S. CONstitution actually had value. From that point on, I tried to limit the amount of paper money in my life - because my study led me to the Biblical truths that gold and silver was supposed to be quote unquote "money" when simple bartering of goods was not sufficient.

Of course, this was "pie-in-the-sky" back in the 1980s. I would trade the 350.00 per week I was making at the quote unquote "church" for silver - then - when I went to the gas station and tried to buy gas with silver - or went to the grocery store and tried to pay in silver - I would get laughed out of the store.

In 2001, I had an accident in my wood working shop and lost some fingers. Several years later, I did an interview on The Information Corner with Sam Britton, and I recounted to him that during that year in which I was hurt, I managed to keep my whole family fed, clothed, sheltered and warm - for less than \$3,600 paper dollars.

I'm not saying at all that men should not be able to make a very nice living for themselves from the fruits of their labor. Not saying that at all. I'm just saying that particularly in the last 20 something years - I've not brought into my life very many U.S. quote unquote dollars. Some of it has been by design and some of it has been because the structure of the U.S. system is so anti-christ - that it actively works hard against and I believe this with my whole heart - there are elements inside that system that do whatever they can to devise quote unquote "laws, statues, regulations, etc.," to purposely make it difficult for people who believe and live like me.

In other words, they have devised quote unquote "laws, statues, regulations, etc.," for the purpose of legislating true Christianity out of society and turning people who have never stolen from anyone, never physically harmed anyone, never even so much as threatened someone, but they have done what they do to try to make Christianity criminal.

Because I have chosen citizenship with the commonwealth of Israel and I do not choose to be a member of the society called U.S. citizens - the cop who has brought all of these things against me - called me a quote - "criminal enterprise."

That is the most ridiculous thing I've ever heard.

One day the persecutor was in court and said, "This man has hidden assets in Indiana." The next day, I demanded that he produce those hidden assets. First off, I'd love to know about them and if I could, I'd really like to get my hands on them if possible. Second, that was a blatant lie and it was said in open court for the purpose of demonizing me and villifying me to turn public opinion against me. And to this day, the judge in the case has never forced the persecutor's office to comply with producing the supposed "hidden assets." Amazing.

So I have actually spent my life trying to rid myself of the quote unquote "money" in the U.S. system - and I've still been accused of having hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of them.

So, if a thief broke in knowing that I had quote unquote "hidden assets" here - maybe he knew something I didn't know - and I guess I'd have to help him look.

Which brings me to another joke I'd like to tell.

A little girl asked her mother, "How did the human race begin?" Her mother answered, "Well, in the beginning, God created the heaven and the earth. And He made Adam and Eve, and they had children, and that's how it began.

The little girl thought for a minute and said, "Well why did Bill Nye the Science Guy say that the human race began with monkeys?" The mother said, "Well dear, I told you about our side of the family, and the scientist told you about his side."

Now, how's that for a ray of sonshine this morning? I've got more, too!

But let's move on now and get the real ray of sonshine from where we left off last weekend.

We have studied the phrase "the last time" over the last couple weeks. John made it as clear as anyone could have made it - he told his readers in the first century - "Little children, it is the last time." I John 2:18.

Then we went over to I Peter 1 and we read Peter telling his readers that they had been kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. Verse 5. Then he told them in verse 6 that their heaviness through manifold temptations would only last for a season - not thousands of years - and in verse 7

That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour

and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:

If they were not going to see the appearing of the Jesus Christ - why tell them? And why tell them again in verse 13

Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind,

Of whose mind? OfYOUR mind. Who is the YOUR here? As clearly as anything can be stated or shown from the Word of God -

to the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia,

Transport yourselves back 2,000 years ago and put yourself in the shoes of these people who received this letter from Peter. Do you believe there was a man named Peter who was a follower of Jesus Christ? A man who talked with Christ, walked with Christ, ate with Christ, heard the very words of Christ with his own ears. Saw Christ crucified - then later saw Him again after He had risen from the dead. Do you believe such a man existed? I do! Do you believe the people Peter was writing to existed? Were there really the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappodocia? Did they actually receive a letter from Peter?

If the things that Peter said to them - did not happen to them - just like Peter said they would - then they were lied to. Intentionally? Absolutely. Because I'll assure you that just like Luke said in Luke 1 that he had achieved perfect understanding of all things even from the beginning - Peter had likewise achieved perfect understanding of all things. If Peter had wanted these persecuted, suffering followers of Jesus Christ to know that his words were really intended for another group of people thousands of years later - he would have told them so.

Look, friends, it's not just a simple mistake to tell people that the Bible doesn't say what it means and mean what it says. If a man says that these people did not see the things that Peter promised to them - then that man is twisting - the Scripture calls it wresting - it's like a wrestling match where men are trying to force each other into their own submission by reason of pain if need be - but they are forcing the Scriptures into things they do not say - and 99 times out of a 100 - it's for an agenda - and it's not a Godly agenda.

be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the

revelation of Jesus Christ;

The Revelation of Jesus Christ that Peter is talking about here is the exact same Revelation of Jesus Christ that the book of Revelation is talking about.

Brought unto you...

Again, friends, if the revelation of Jesus Christ was not brought unto the YOU - the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, - then they were lied to. And if they were lied to - then all of us have been lied to. If we do not properly understand who this book was written to, when it was written, then we'll not understand why it was written and the meaning of it.

And that's exactly where we are today in 2019 in not just America, but all over the world because this lie - that Peter did not mean what he so clearly said to those first century saints - was actually meant for another place, another time, another people - has spread all across the entire world and the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ has been changed into something that resembles absolutely nothing of the faith once delivered to the saints.

Friends, I'm trying to be as gentle as I can - but I don't know how gentle you should be when a freight train is barreling down the tracks getting ready to run over anything and everyone in its path - but if you - or someone you know - does not understand that ALL Bible prophecy was fulfilled in the first century - in the generation that Christ so plainly told, "Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass away, till ALL these things be fulfilled" - if you - or someone you know thinks that Christ was speaking of a people, place and time thousands of years from the time He said those things - then people who believe such things have never accepted the true Gospel preached by John the Baptist, the disciples, and by Christ Himself.

And finally from I Peter 1:18-20

Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers;

[**19**] But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

[**20**] Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you,

These people were in the last times. The last times means the end of the Old Covenant age. It was the end of the Old Covenant World. It was the passing of the heavens and the earth. It was elements - the elementary principles and rudiments of the old covenant system - that would soon be dissolving and melting away with a fervent heat. They were coming into the days of the New Covenant, the New World, the new heavens and the earth, the new Jerusalem which is from above.

They - the strangers scattered - in the first century - the recipients of Peter's letter - they were in the last days - the last times.

Again, and again, and again, "Charlie, why is this so important?"

I Peter 2. Quite possibly, an argument could be made that the most important word in all of this first epistle of Peter is the first word of chapter 2: Wherefore.

Peter has moved on from telling these people that they were the fulfillment of Bible prophecy. The prophets had only hoped to see what these strangers of Pontus, Galatia and Cappodocia were seeing with their own eyes.

Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

[**10**] Of which salvation the prophets have inquired and searched diligently, who prophesied of the grace that should come unto you:

[**11**] Searching what, or what manner of time the Spirit of Christ which was in them did signify, when it testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ, and the glory that should follow.

[**12**] Unto whom it was revealed, that not unto themselves, but unto us they did minister the things, which are now reported unto you by them that have preached the gospel unto you with the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven; which things the angels desire to look into. I Peter 1:9-12.

Wherefore.

Webster's 1828 dictionary says this for Wherefore: It is an adverb (where and for) meaning: For this reason. Why; for what reason.

Strong's Concordance says:

Certainly, or accordingly, and, but now (then), so (likewise then), then, therefore, verily, wherefore.

Peter is saying, Wherefore, because of what I just told you about being in the Last Times, about being in the presence of the Revelation of Jesus Christ, of fulfilling the prophets, here's what it all means.

That's what I've been trying to say throughout my entire ministry - there's a reason - there's a wherefore - because All Bible Prophecy was fulfilled in the first century - there is an accordingly, a so likewise then - there is a Why; for what reason.

I Peter 2, beginning in verse 1:

[1] Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings,

[2] As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:

Peter is saying, "Alright, it's time to start growing. You've been a part of the greatest events in the history of mankind. You've experienced the days where the very Son of God walked with men, talked with men, revealed to men the deep mysteries of the things of God which had been foreordained before the foundation of the world. The things that the prophets desired to see - but did not - they have been revealed to you - now let's roll up our sleeves and get to work. Let's take this knowledge, this wherefore, and begin to grow. Verse 3.

[3] If so be ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious.

[4] To whom coming, as unto a living stone, disallowed indeed of men, but chosen of God, and precious,

In my Matthew 24 series - which lasted for more than a year - I tried to lay foundations so that when we got to this point - I Peter 2:4 - we would have those "Aha moments" and instantly connect the dots. I can only hope and pray that as we read verse 4 concerning Christ the stone - that your mind instantly went to the book of Daniel where in Daniel's prophecy in chapter 2 in revealing the king's dream - he prophesied according to the Messiah and the Messiah's Kingdom, that

[**34**] Thou sawest till that a stone was cut out without hands, which smote the image upon his feet that were of iron and clay, and brake them to pieces.

[**35**] Then was the iron, the clay, the brass, the silver, and the gold, broken to pieces together, and became like the chaff of the summer threshingfloors; and

the wind carried them away, that no place was found for them: and the stone that smote the image became a great mountain, and filled the whole earth. [45] Forasmuch as thou sawest that the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands, and that it brake in pieces the iron, the brass, the clay, the silver, and the gold; the great God hath made known to the king what shall come to pass hereafter: and the dream is certain, and the interpretation thereof sure.

The stone from Daniel 2 is Christ. Then as you read the word "disallowed indeed of men" from verse 4 of I Peter 2, your mind instantly went to Matthew 21 regarding the householder and his vineyard. Because this is so vitally important in connecting the dots, please turn again to Matthew 21. Yes, we've been there before. I was trying to lay the foundation for when we got to I Peter 2: 4, but let's look at it again and ask God to burn these things into our memories so we will understand them and never forget them. Verse 33 of Matthew 21. The Words of Christ.

Hear another parable: There was a certain householder, which planted a vineyard, and hedged it round about, and digged a winepress in it, and built a tower, and let it out to husbandmen, and went into a far country:

[**34**] And when the time of the fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the husbandmen, that they might receive the fruits of it.

[**35**] And the husbandmen took his servants, and beat one, and killed another, and stoned another.

[**36**] Again, he sent other servants more than the first: and they did unto them likewise.

[**37**] But last of all he sent unto them his son, saying, They will reverence my son. [**38**] But when the husbandmen saw the son, they said among themselves, This is the heir; come, let us kill him, and let us seize on his inheritance.

[**39**] And they caught him, and cast him out of the vineyard, and slew him.

[**40**] When the lord therefore of the vineyard cometh, what will he do unto those husbandmen?

[**41**] They say unto him, He will miserably destroy those wicked men, and will let out his vineyard unto other husbandmen, which shall render him the fruits in their seasons.

[**42**] Jesus saith unto them, Did ye never read in the scriptures, The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner: this is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes?

[**43**] Therefore say I unto you, The kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and given to a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof.

[44] And whosoever shall fall on this stone shall be broken: but on whomsoever it

shall fall, it will grind him to powder.

[**45**] And when the chief priests and Pharisees had heard his parables, they perceived that he spake of them.

[46] But when they sought to lay hands on him, they feared the multitude, because they took him for a prophet.

Daniel's stone is the Messiah. The kingdom Daniel prophesied concerning is the Kingdom of the Messiah. Jesus revealed in Matthew 21 that He was the stone. He was the fulfillment of the Scriptures of Daniel. Now, Peter in I Peter 2 is confirming the prophecy of Daniel and the Words of Jesus.

Look at Psalm 118, please. Beginning in verse 1. I am going to tell you that this chapter is a prophecy of the coming of the Messiah. This is David looking for the day in which the Messiah was to be revealed. This is a description of that day, by David.

[1] O give thanks unto Yahweh; for he is good: because his mercy endureth for ever.

[2] Let Israel now say, that his mercy endureth for ever.

[3] Let the house of Aaron now say, that his mercy endureth for ever.

[4] Let them now that fear Yahweh say, that his mercy endureth for ever.

[5] I called upon Yahweh in distress: Yahweh answered me, and set me in a large place.

[6] Yahweh is on my side; I will not fear: what can man do unto me?

[7] Yahweh taketh my part with them that help me: therefore shall I see my desire upon them that hate me.

[8] It is better to trust in Yahweh than to put confidence in man.

[9] It is better to trust in Yahweh than to put confidence in princes.

[10] All nations compassed me about: but in the name of Yahweh will I destroy them.

[**11**] They compassed me about; yea, they compassed me about: but in the name of Yahweh I will destroy them.

[**12**] They compassed me about like bees; they are quenched as the fire of thorns: for in the name of Yahweh I will destroy them.

[13] Thou hast thrust sore at me that I might fall: but Yahweh helped me.

[14] Yahweh is my strength and song, and is become my salvation.

[15] The voice of rejoicing and salvation is in the tabernacles of the righteous: the right hand of Yahweh doeth valiantly.

[16] The right hand of Yahweh is exalted: the right hand of Yahweh doeth valiantly.

[17] I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of Yahweh.

[18] Yahweh hath chastened me sore: but he hath not given me over unto death.[19] Open to me the gates of righteousness: I will go into them, and I will praise Yahweh:

[20] This gate of Yahweh, into which the righteous shall enter.

[21] I will praise thee: for thou hast heard me, and art become my salvation.[22] The stone which the builders refused is become the head stone of the corner.

There is word for word the prophecy that was fulfilled. I want to stop here for just a second and express a little concern. I cannot say why the king James translators did what they did in I Peter 2 verse 4. Sadly, it seems like a pattern, but I'm not going to come out and say it. Remember Hebrews 2:12 and Psalm 22:22? Hebrews 2:12 is a direct quotation from Psalm 22:22. In Psalm 22:22, the English word used is congregation. But in Hebrews 2:12, the kjv translators took it upon themselves to change the word from congregation to church. That's just not right. Whenever the last 27 books of the Bible quote from the first 39 books of the Bible - the words should be the same. That way, we can easily see - by word comparison - when things were fulfilled or when they were cited hundreds of years apart.

In Psalm 118:22, the English word is refused...the builders refused. But in I Peter 2 - and there is no doubt that Peter was quoting David - yet the English translators used the word disallowed instead of refused. But if you look at the Greek word for disallowed - it means refused. I don't know why they did what they did. I can't imagine they didn't know that Psalm 118:22 was where Peter quoted from. Maybe they didn't know. Who knows? To me, it's important. Whichever word the translators had agreed to use - it should have been the same English word in both places. Psalm 118:23

- [23] This is Yahweh's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes.
- [24] This is the day which Yahweh hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

Stop here for a second. All my life I've heard this verse just pulled out of the Scripture and laid out on a table and used for just any day. Any ole day, This is the day which the Lord hath made, we will rejoice and be glad in it. But the reality is, David is referring to a very specific day. Of course I'm not saying we shouldn't rejoice and be glad daily - but David is pointing to a very specific day. And that day was being fulfilled in the lives of those first century believers that Peter was writing to in I Peter 2.

This is the day where a new nation was being founded. This is the day where the stone was getting ready to fall and the Kingdom was going to be taken from a people who

didn't deserve it - and given to a people who embraced the King and His Kingdom. It's important that we understand the prophecies contained in the first 39 books and then see then fulfilled before the last 27 books ended. Psalm 118:25

[25] Save now, I beseech thee, O Yahweh: O Yahweh, I beseech thee, send now prosperity.

[26] Blessed be he that cometh in the name of Yahweh: we have blessed you out of the house of Yahweh.

Again, here is a direct reference to the coming of Christ. Of Jesus it was said in Matthew 21:9

And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.

Of Jesus it was said in Matthew 23:39

For I say unto you, Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

Of Jesus is was said in Mark 11

And they that went before, and they that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna; Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord:

[**10**] Blessed be the kingdom of our father David, that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

Back to Psalm 118:27

[27] God is Yahweh, which hath shewed us light: bind the sacrifice with cords, even unto the horns of the altar.

[28] Thou art my God, and I will praise thee: thou art my God, I will exalt thee.

[29] O give thanks unto Yahweh; for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever.

Oh how I hope you see how these passages of Scripture so beautifully and perfectly harmonize one with another.

Let's go back to I Peter 2:5

[5] Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.

Here is the beginning of your purpose, says Peter to these saints in the first century. They were being used to build a foundation. Foundations are built upon rocks. Again, your mind should immediately be taken back once again to the parable of Christ concerning building upon the rock and not upon the sand. The rock is Christ. And Christ was using these first century saints as lively stones building the foundation of His spiritual house.

Why does it say his spiritual house? Why does the word spiritual have to be here? Because the house they were building was the foundation of the New Jerusalem, the house of God in the New Covenant World. It's not a physical house. It's a house built without hands. It's a place where no physical temple resides because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple therein.

This is a house that has no walls, it has no borders. It is a house that is supposed to cover the whole earth and bring everyone and everything into the dominion of the King of kings and Lord of lords.

Why is it a holy priesthood? Why do they offer spiritual sacrifices? Because the days of the Levitical priesthood were coming to an end. The days of offering sacrifices were coming to an end. The Old Covenant World that contained those things was ending. They were in the Last Times. They were in the Last Days. They were in the End of the Old Covenant World. Peter was instructing them concerning the foundations they were building for the New World - the New house - the New Jerusalem which is from above - the New Covenant. Verse 6.

[6] Wherefore also it is contained in the scripture, Behold, I lay in Sion a chief corner stone, elect, precious: and he that believeth on him shall not be confounded.

Please go to Isaiah 28. Once again, just like David, Isaiah was prophesying of the day (I almost said a day) in which the Messiah would come. Isaiah 28:16 - he was prophesying of THE day

Therefore thus saith the Lord Yahweh, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a

stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste.

Again, I'm not sure why the kjv translators did not make sure these English words were exactly the same in both places, but nonetheless, this is the Scripture that Peter was referring to. Understand that the prophecies of Isaiah were being fulfilled in the first century with the coming of the Messiah - namely Jesus - Yeshua. Jesus - Yeshua fulfilled the prophecies of David and Isaiah and Peter was teaching those that received his letter - in the first century - you are seeing David's prophecy fulfilled - you are seeing Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled.

Friends, it just can't be any clearer. David's prophecy, Isaiah's prophecy - they are not for any other time than for the time in which the Scriptures say - in the first century. And it is the Wherefore, the Why then - that's what makes all the difference in the world - and we are getting there. Stay with me. Verse 7, I Peter 2.

[7] Unto you therefore which believe he is precious: but unto them which be disobedient, the stone which the builders disallowed, the same is made the head of the corner,

[8] And a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offence, even to them which stumble at the word, being disobedient: whereunto also they were appointed.

Briefly, it's off the subject a little bit. But I just can't read this and not at least mention the awesome importance of that little phrase - whereunto also they were appointed. I Peter 1:2 refers to the recipients of the letter as the "elect." As I pointed out last week, the elect of I Peter 1:2 is the same "elect" as Matthew 24 and the other verses I cited.

In these several verses of I Peter 2:6-8, we see some who were the "elect of God" and we see some who were appointed to disobedience. I've touched on this briefly in the past, and we are going to get into it much deeper in the future - but these verses are very important which when we understand pre-destination, foreordination and the understanding of "whosoever will may come." I ask you - the disobedient from verse 8 - whereunto also they were appointed - did they have a choice? If they were appointed to be disobedient? Who appointed them? Did they appoint themselves to disobedience? The "elect"? Who elected them? Did they elect themselves? If not, Who elected them?

The understanding that election was for the Old Covenant World - and whosoever will may come is for the New Covenant World - gives me the greatest hope that we -

through our obedience to the understanding of the Scripture - understanding the Wherefore of I Peter 2 and what is means for us today - for all of us who came after the foundation of the Kingdom was built in the first century - this understanding gives me the greatest amount of hope that we are not doomed to hopelessness by the enemies of Christ that seem to outnumber us so much today. We can - through our obedience to the King, Kingdom and the Perfect Will of God for His Creation - can turn the world upside down - just like the Apostles did - and it could happen in a relatively short amount of time if we would only understand what Christ did in the first century and why it matters.

I said everything I have said in all my 35 plus years of ministry to get to I Peter 2 verse 9. This is the whole conclusion of the Wherefore of verse 1. This is the reason why the prophecies were fulfilled. This is where Christ has brought His people - who His people are supposed to be and what they are supposed to be doing today.

Verse 9 was absolutely speaking to a specific people at a specific time. But what we are seeing here so plainly - with all the references to words such as corner stones and buildings, and rocks and houses - is that these people were being used to build a foundation. They were the foundation of the Kingdom of God. They were the foundation of the Kingdom of God that was taken from people who were not worthy and given to people who brought forth fruit because they had embraced the King.

This is the foundation they built - not just for themselves - but for all those who would come after them and embrace the King. For all those that came after them and confessed that Jesus Christ had come in the flesh. That Jesus Christ had fulfilled all the prophecies. That Jesus Christ was crucified, that He rose again in fulfillment of the Davidic Covenant of II Samuel 7. Listen, it's not enough to say the Gospel is the death, burial and resurrection of Christ. The devils - whatever they were - believed that - and even trembled at it. But it's because they knew that the resurrection of Christ was not just a miracle like that performed on Lazarus - but because it was the fulfillment of the promise to David that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh He God would raise up Christ to sit on His throne. This same Jesus, whom you crucified and hung on a tree, hath God made both Lord and Saviour.

He's King of kings and Lord of lords. He is the ONLY Potentate, the ONLY King that God allows for His creation in the New Covenant World. In the New Covenant World He has commanded that all men everywhere repent. That all men everywhere bow the knee and confess that He is King.

His Kingship and His Kingdom is not for a future coronation. The King came in the first century. The King did every single thing He was supposed to do and He was crowned King of kings and Lord of lords and since that time it has been the responsibility of every living, breathing creature to conform to His Kingdom - and friends - if they haven't done so - they are lost. If what you believe about salvation, if what you believe about the Gospel - was based on future understandings - then today - right now - I would invite you to Come into the Kingdom and embrace the King today - because what you have been taught before has been a lie. The quote unquote "gospel" that has been invented by, evolutionized and convoluted by something called the "church" and the "churchmen" is not the Gospel of the Kingdom that was preached by John the Baptist - wait a minute, I need to stop doing that. The Gospel of the Kingdom was preached all the way back from Moses - through all the prophets - by John the Baptist, the disciples and Christ. And it's the Gospel of the Kingdom. It is not the gospel of the death, burial and resurrection - that's just a part of it - its the Gospel of the Kingdom.

Seek ye first the Kingdom, Jesus said. If you have been taught that the Kingdom is in the future - then friends - the Gospel has not been taught to you. And how can we believe in what we have not heard?

## I Peter 2:9, finally,

[9] But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:

[**10**] Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.

Who is he talking to? Once again, make no mistake who wrote this letter, who he wrote it to and when he wrote it. Those first century saints. The ones who the foundation of the Kingdom was being built upon - they were a chosen generation. Specifically a chosen generation. That generation was chosen before the foundation of the world. Before the foundation of the world, God had already established, pre-destined, foreordained His plan. The Messiah would come and be born in that generation - that specific place and time. That genea - that period of time, the people, the time, the place.

If we don't understand this, we can't possibly understand the rest of the Bible. Peter said of which salvation the prophets have enquired and searched diligently who prophesied of the grace that CAME UNTO THEM.

They were the chosen generation. They were the elect. To the disobedient described in this chapter - Matthew 23:

Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell? [**34**] Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall kill and crucify; and some of them shall ye scourge in your synagogues, and persecute them from city to city:

[**35**] That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the temple and the altar.

[36] Verily I say unto you, All these things shall come upon this generation.

That generation in the first century was the chosen generation of I Peter 2:9. They were the elect, they were the chosen to believe in the Christ. In that generation was also those who were appointed to disobedience. It was that generation - in the first century.

[37] O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not![38] Behold, your house is left unto you desolate.

I Peter 2:9 again:

[9] But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:

[**10**] Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.

This chosen generation was a royal priesthood. Royalty has always been equated as government. Earthly kings are mistakenly referred to as royalty. But these people being the chosen generation of the King and being made joint-heirs with the King and ambassadors for the King - royalty is a good description. They were called a holy nation.

Somehow because of our dumbed down way of thinking and our inexcusable lack of knowing and understanding the Scriptures most read this description of a holy nation and somehow conclude that it's value or meaning is only something for the heavenlies or something that only has spiritual value. Nothing could be further from the truth. Not

only is this nation a real nation - but it is the ONLY legitimate, God ordained nation allowed to exist in the New Covenant World.

This has political implications. Just like Rushdoony said when he said the word Gospel is an imperalistic, political term - this nation here in I Peter 2:9 is imperialistic and political. It is the nation that has a King. It is the nation that has Laws. It is the nation that has people - and those people are those who were called out of darkness into his marvelous light. They are a peculiar people in that they reject any and all forms of man's governments that seek to take upon themselves the power - and that's what it is - it is power - brute force like wild beasts - power to define what they believe is good and evil - then compel by force, persuasion, through threats of violence or violence itself for other men to submit to their definitions or face the consequences. This is not God ordained authority but it is the powers of darkness, the rulers of the darkness of this world. In Acts 26, Paul said it like this:

To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me.

The power of Satan - whatever that entity was - and whatever operates in the spirit of Satan today is when men take it upon themselves to define good and evil. It was that way from the very beginning - and it continues today.

Romans 13:12 with Paul teaching men what the Government of God is in the New Covenant World - through the Ecclesia:

The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light.

Ephesians 6:10-12

Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. [**11**] Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

[**12**] For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

Colossians 1:12-13

Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light:

[13] Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son:

Being called out of darkness and into a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a peculiar people is to come out of the belief system that mere men are ordained by God to redefine what God has already determined to be good and evil - and to make up their own quote unquote "laws" which then become "statues" and compel men to obey them. This is the powers of darkness. This is what the chosen generation was called out of and into the Kingdom of God - a holy nation - Governed by a Holy King - with Holy Laws.

For us today - almost 2,000 years removed from the first century - this is what the foundation of Christianity is. This is what we were supposed to be building on. But along the way, we were beguiled. We were lied to and we bought the lie. We listened to people tell us that Peter didn't really mean what he was saying back then. He meant those things for a future time period. Not for back then. Not for today. They always tell you it's soon coming - because they know they can keep you in darkness by promising hopes of deliverance. They always tell you of a day coming - in the future - just not for today. It's always tomorrow - then tomorrow comes and goes - and it's always for tomorrow.

We are now nearly 2,000 years from the words of Paul in II Corinthians 6:

(For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)

But the majority of the people are still looking for a future king and future kingdom. No friends. Paul said 2,000 years today was the day. If you have not embraced the King and His Kingdom already - I would invite you bow the knee to the King - Who still today - is quick and ready to reveal Himself to all who will seek Him.

Surely, we are able to agree - and see very clearly - that the writers of I John and I Peter wanted their readers to know and understand that they - the recipients of the letters were in the Last Time. They wanted them to know beyond any shadow of a doubt that the Kingdom was soon coming and that they were the lively stones that were being

used to build the foundation - Jesus Christ Himself revealed as the chief cornerstone.

Peter was letting them know that they were fulfilling the Words of Christ from Matthew 21. They were the nation, the holy nation, the people of God. These were the ones being faithful to the Perfect Will of God for His Creation to come out from the powers of darkness and into the Kingdom of God.

God has a nation. God has a people. few Very people seem to understand this today because of the great deception of futurism. If I Peter 2 could somehow be twisted into futurism, then we would have to conclude that there is no nation of God today. That men are bound to submit to and obey anyone or anything else that calls itself a nation. But to do so, is to unravel and roll back the entire purpose and plan that God has for His creation. A plan that was foreordained before the foundation of the world.

Calling men out from the domain of darkness and translating them into the Kingdom of God's own Son is that purpose. This is why the world - the enemies of Christ - those who live in rebellion - those who want the power to define good and evil according to their ways - constantly seek to keep people from finding the Gospel of the Kingdom of God. We must be ever vigilant. We must awaken as many people as we can to the truth that the Kingdom of God was established 2,000 years ago - and it is the only God ordained Nation and Kingdom that He allows for His creation.
