

**Message# 170 - 12-26-2021 - Christians Believe the Prophecies were Fulfilled in Christ**  
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Good morning everyone. Thank you for taking the time to listen to the message this morning.

Michael sent me his latest Minute yesterday and it is really a good one. This one is called "The Kids Are Alright." I strongly urge you go and read this. The man's got a computer for a brain. I read his writings and I tell Teresa, "I'm just blown away at the things he remembers from some of the wildest sources" - things I never even heard of - but things that some of the most influential people have said and done and how those things apply today is amazing. It's very good writing - from someone who believes that the Kingdom is now. I have so many things to say today, I don't even know where to begin. I want to get back to where we left off last week - then I want to jump ahead to where we are soon heading hopefully - but so many things are happening right - I'm almost at a loss to how to begin today. So, we'll just get started and see where the Lord leads us this morning.

One of our regular listeners, I've never said his name on the air - and I won't today because I didn't ask his permission. But he writes to me often. I don't like to use the word "proud" - pride is not a good thing - but in the sense that you feel like someone did something great - or said something great - or testified in a great way - you know the feeling I'm trying to put out there - without saying the word "proud". I was very happy to read an email that came into me this week from this man. I did not realize he was such a warrior against the jab - and that is great - but apparently he has been and has quite possibly lost friends over it. Apparently he had asked one of his friends why she took the jab. He sent me her response. The fact that he felt like her response was something that I needed to hear tells me that he has been listening to the messages. And not just listening, but things are sinking in. Listen to this, it's very short. Here's the reason why one of his friends took the jab. Quote:

*I truly believe that my steps have been ordered by YVYH & that He knows the exact number of days grant unto me when He was creating me in the secret place as He did for each of you.*

Wow. That's why she took the job - because - irregardless she took the job and it didn't matter. There you have predestination in all its glory laid out and being applied today as a reason why it was perfectly fine to take the job. I'm happy that this man sent me this email - knowing that he sees how unBiblical - a statement like that is. "I can do anything I want to do - because I am predestined - no matter what I do - in the end - doesn't make any difference."

I received some great responses from last week's message in regards to my comments concerning Josh Duggar. Many of them were from people who had never heard of Josh Duggar, or his family, but kind of figured out what I was talking about as I was examining the situation. I have never seen 19 and Counting - or whatever the name of the TV show they were doing about his family. But, the show was about this "churchian" family that had 19 brothers and sisters. And they were all supposed to be these evangelical churchians - and the show got canceled several years ago when it was discovered that Josh had molested his own sisters when he was in his teens - I forget the details. Then, when Josh aged - I was going to say - when he grew up - but that certainly doesn't seem to be the case - when he got older - he went to Washington DC to work for some "churchian lobbyist" group - or something like that - and got fired from that because of affairs and pornography.

I didn't want to go into all that. I wrongly assumed that most people knew about that family and knew what they were going through with Josh's trial.

So, I'm glad that even for those that did not know who he is - they still were able to get the gist of what I was trying to say in regards to all that.

As I have been saying in my messages over the past several weeks or months, I am now trying to get us to see that there is a huge difference between a true Christian and a churchian. We were using I John chapter 4 and chapter 5 to show that a true Christian is one who believes that Jesus, Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century - was the Christ. He was the King. He came to be King. He came to set up His Kingdom. And anyone who does not believe this - is not born of God.

Look, friends, I did not write the book. I am only reading from it - just like everyone else - and it says - as plainly as anything can be written - those that believe that Jesus was the Christ - the King - the Anointed One - if a man believes this - he is born of God. If he doesn't believe this - he is not of God. That's cut and dry.

That being said - let me go a step further and say this. If a man believes that Jesus, Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century - did not fulfill all the prophets - then that man - I don't care how many times he says - "I believe that Jesus was the Christ" - I'm sorry - I don't care how many times you say that - you simply cannot have it both ways. You cannot say that Jesus was the Christ - and say that Jesus, Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century - and say that He did not fulfill all the prophecies.

This week, I have spent quite a bit of time listening to "rabbi" Tovia Singer. Singer is one of, if not, the top Jewish rabbis in all of the U.S. today. He has a ton of videos on YouTube and his main mission is to convince people that Jesus - was not the Messiah. From the opening page of his own website, [outreachjudaism.org](http://outreachjudaism.org), listen to this, please:

*Christians are baffled by the Jewish rejection of Jesus, and Jews are bewildered why Christians would even entertain the notion that Jesus is the messiah. In this eye-opening presentation, Rabbi Tovia Singer illustrates that graphic messianic prophecies found in the Book of Ezekiel oppose central Christian teachings about Jesus. End quote.*

This week, Larry Blanchard, who has written several books on Fulfilled Bible Prophecy, sent me a link to a video that was put out by a man who claims to be a "Christian Israel" preacher. The man is saying that several key prophecies were not fulfilled in the first century. In his video, he made a statement made by almost all futurists - almost every one of them I've ever talked to, "We know because history tells us so....so we know the prophecies were not fulfilled in the first century." In the video, this man specifically cites Malachi chapter 4 as not being fulfilled.

Through the years I've had many discussions with "churchians" who argue that the last chapters of Ezekiel have never been fulfilled. They have argued that Daniel has not been fulfilled. As recently as two weeks ago I had a "preacher" tell me that Daniel has not been fulfilled. They argue that the book of Zechariah has not been fulfilled.

Listen to me, please, so there is no misunderstanding whatsoever, the arguments that people are making against Fulfilled Bible Prophecy - the passages they use to find against it - are the EXACT same passages the Jews use to say that - "Because Jesus did not fulfill those prophecies - He was not the Messiah."

If you don't believe me, go to YouTube and do a search for "rabbi" Tovia Singer. Watch his videos. You will hear him say over and over and over - Jesus was not the Messiah because He did not fulfill the prophecies.

One of the most aggravating things that I deal with, when trying to help people understand exactly Who Jesus, Who Yeshua was, is that they do not understand the prophecies from the Old Covenant. Oh, they sure act like they do. They'll say little catch phrases they learned in some "church" somewhere.

Sad to say it, but the jews know their jewish bibles - 10 times - 100 times more - in fact - I would say that Tovia Singer probably knows the "churchian bible" better than 99 out of 100 "preachers." If a man says that the book of Ezekiel has not been fulfilled - he is saying - just like the jewish "rabbi" - that Jesus was not the Messiah.

I'm going to play a few minutes of an excerpt from a message preached by Singer concerning the last chapters of the book of Ezekiel. This is right on the home page of his website, Tovia Singer. Listen to this:

Stop right there. Did you here what he said? He said the last several chapters of the book of Ezekiel give some of the most graphic end time prophecies. And in the end times - the messiah - the jewish messiah will be revealed.

This is why I have said - I've been screaming it now for almost 40 years - if a man believes the "end times" have not already occurred - Jesus, Yeshua the Christ, was not the Messiah. The book of Ezekiel - here - the most renowned jewish "rabbi" of today - saying that the book of Ezekiel is referring to the end times. If the book of Ezekiel is referring to the end times - and the end times have not already taken place - the Messiah has not come.

This is what I mean about people not knowing their Bibles. You can't have it both ways. If Jesus, if Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century - if He did not come - IN THE END TIMES - then He was not the Messiah. That's what the prophets said. The Messiah would come in the end times. That's why the jews do not accept Jesus. Alright, listen a little bit more.

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Stop right there. "It describes the building of a third temple that will stand in Jerusalem for all times." Do you know how many "churchians" through the years have told me that the temple will be rebuilt in Jerusalem? They have even gone so far as to talk about the

red heifer and the reinstatement of animal sacrifices. That is the jews' religion.

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This is exactly what "churchians" have been preaching for as long as I have been alive. Friends, if this is true, then Jesus was not the Messiah. This is what I have been trying to get people to see. Futurism is the jews' religion. It is a complete denial that Jesus was the Messiah. The prophets say the Messiah will be revealed in the end times and He will cause the temple to be rebuilt again - He will reinstate animal sacrifices. If this is what a man believes - that man is a jew. That is the jews' religion.

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Stop right there. "All christians agree, these are Messianic."

No. That is not true. All CHURCHIANS agree. Not Christians. True Christians believe that ALL - A-L-L of the prophecies were fulfilled in Jesus, in Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century. The Messianic Age was in the first century. Any one who does not believe that Jesus, Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century - in the Messianic Age - fulfilled ALL the prophecies - is not a Christian.

Singer - all he knows about - are churchians. He has never encountered a true Christian. When he teaches his message on the book of Daniel - while he is laughing at what he falsely says are "christians" - and the "churchians" are agreeing with him about the book of Daniel being future - he literally laughs at what he says is the "ridiculousness of (and he erroneously calls them christians)" - "the ridiculousness of the "christians" because they do not know the Bible."

But a true Christian knows that the book of Daniel HAS been fulfilled, and the 70 weeks of Daniel brings the timeline of the fulfillment of that book directly to the first century. Singer has never found a true Christian that CAN take the book of Daniel and show - by the numbers - that the prophecy was fulfilled by Jesus the Christ in the first century.

People that say the book of Daniel is yet to be fulfilled are preaching the jews' religion and the "rabbis" are laughing hysterically at how stupid these people are who claim to be "christians" but preach the jews' religion. Listen some more.

Stop right there. "When the sanctuary will be in your midst, then the nations will know that I am Lord." Future. That's in the future says the jewish "rabbi."

In the video that I was telling you about from the "christian israel preacher" - he says that because there is evil in the world today - and there is no worldwide acknowledgement of God - there is no way that All Bible Prophecy was fulfilled on or before AD70. This is exactly what the jewish "rabbi" is saying.

If the prophecies are yet to be fulfilled - then Jesus, Yeshua was not the Messiah.

When Christ Himself said, in Luke 21:22 -

"For these be the days of vengeance, when all things that are written shall be fulfilled...."

our job then is to take those prophecies from the Old Covenant prophets and figure out how they were fulfilled in the Messiah - in Jesus - in Yeshua the Christ of the first century. If Jesus, if Yeshua the Christ, did not fulfill all the Old Covenant prophecies - He was not the Messiah.

This is the reason why the jews reject Jesus. Because they say that Jesus did not fulfill the prophecies - all of them.

The "christian israel" preacher that was saying that Malachi 4 has not been fulfilled - is preaching the jews' religion and he is not in Christ. That might make some people real mad - but it's the truth and I'm not backing down. If the "christian israel preacher" repents - we can have a discussion.

This morning, turn to Malachi chapter 3. The jewish "rabbis" also say that the book of Malachi has not been fulfilled. The jewish "rabbis" do not believe that Jesus, Yeshua, the One Who came in the first century - they do not believe He was the Messiah. Why? Because the Messiah will fulfill the prophets. That's what they say. Malachi chapter 3. Glance up with me to verse 17 of chapter 2. Remember now - judgement has not come - so the prophecies were not fulfilled on or before AD70 and the text was Malachi chapter 4 for this proof. Chapter 2, verse 17:

Ye have wearied Yahweh with your words. Yet ye say, Wherein have we wearied him? When ye say, Every one that doeth evil is good in the sight of Yahweh, and

he delighteth in them; or, Where is the God of judgment?

Now chapter 3, verse 1.

[1] Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to **this** temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

Oh boy. I need to check something. I cannot believe what I just read. As I have told many of you, I spend many hours preparing my messages. Sometimes as much as half a day or more. And, I copy and paste most of my texts from an online version of the Bible. And, I've told you several times before to be careful and don't rely on the online versions all the time. Same with Strong's Concordance - same with Webster's 1828. When I just read verse 1, it was a copy and paste from an online version and what a mistake I just found. The online version says

Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to **this** temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

That is not what the text says. The text says this:

Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to **his** temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

That's a pretty big mistake. HIS temple - not this temple. Wow. I am really really glad that I had this verse memorized.

Thy Word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.

Oh how we need to memorize as much of the book as we can.

In this chapter, we are looking for the God of judgement. The answers begin coming right here in verse 1 of chapter 3.

First thing coming.

Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me:

This is hugely important. I cannot stress that enough. We are going to see this prophecy fulfilled - in Jesus, in Yeshua the Christ, in the first century. If a man says this has not happened - more than likely - that man will be a jewish "rabbi." Or, he will be a "churchian." He might even be a "christian israel preacher." Better stated, a "churchian israel preacher." If a man says Malachi 3:1 is unfulfilled - that man is not a follower of Christ. That man has never been born of God. Why? Because if this prophecy is intended to be fulfilled in the Messiah, and a man says it's not fulfilled yet - then the Messiah has not come. If a man believes the Messiah has not come - that man is not born of God. Plain and simple. Verse 2.

[2] But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap:

[3] And he shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver: and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto Yahweh an offering in righteousness.

This is the judgement. This is the prophesied judgement day. The jews say this day has never taken place. And because of that, there is no way that Jesus was the Messiah. The day of judgement and the coming of Messiah are one and the same. They are inseparable. Verse 4.

[4] Then shall the offering of Judah and Jerusalem be pleasant unto Yahweh, as in the days of old, and as in former years.

[5] And I will come near to you to judgment; and I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and against false swearers, and against (now watch this one) those that oppress the hireling in his wages (hmm), the widow, and the fatherless, and that turn aside the stranger from his right, and fear not me, saith Yahweh of hosts.

The jews say this day has never happened. This judgement has never occurred. If this has not occurred then the Messiah has not come. If you stand there and say that this is unfulfilled Bible prophecy - you are a jew. You are a jew because you preach or believe the jews' religion. This is exactly what the jews say. This day of judgement has not occurred. And, in the video from the "churchian israel preacher" this week - he says -

this has not occurred. And, we “know because history tells us” this definitely did not occur at AD70.

Please go back to verse 1.

Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

Where is the judgement day of the Lord prophesied to come?

shall suddenly come to his temple

Please keep your finger here in Malachi 4 and turn to I Peter chapter 4. We will begin in verse 17. Listen to what Peter wrote concerning the first century.

For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God:

Does that sound like future to Peter? Could. It could possibly sound like that. But there's no possible way we could construe his words to mean thousands of years later. The first century was the time of fulfillment for the prophecy concerning the judgement of Malachi chapter 4.

and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God?

**[18]** And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear?

**[19]** Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God commit the keeping of their souls to him in well doing, as unto a faithful Creator.

For those of you who already understand this - your minds are probably screaming, Matthew 24:1-3 when we read Malachi 3:1

Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

And, rightly so, because that is exactly what Malachi was prophesying. Rightly so, concerning those of you who are saying we should go to Matthew 24:1-3. I am again, totally amazed that someone who would call themselves a “christian” - cannot see the unbelievable, unmistakable, insurmountable importance in the temple being destroyed at AD70. I just sit here and shake my head about this. Jesus - if you believe that He was the Messiah - of the first century - He likened the destruction of the temple - not one stone left standing upon another that shall not be thrown down - this was so monumental - He called it “the end of the world.” It was the end of the age. It was the end of the Old Covenant World. To pass that off as insignificant - is exactly what the religion of the jews is and does. Back to Malachi 3, verse 6.

- [6] For I am Yahweh, I change not; therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.
- [7] Even from the days of your fathers ye are gone away from mine ordinances, and have not kept them. Return unto me, and I will return unto you, saith Yahweh of hosts. But ye said, Wherein shall we return?
- [8] Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings.
- [9] Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation.
- [10] Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith Yahweh of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.
- [11] And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith Yahweh of hosts.
- [12] And all nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith Yahweh of hosts.
- [13] Your words have been stout against me, saith Yahweh. Yet ye say, What have we spoken so much against thee?
- [14] Ye have said, It is vain to serve God: and what profit is it that we have kept his ordinance, and that we have walked mournfully before Yahweh of hosts?
- [15] And now we call the proud happy; yea, they that work wickedness are set up; yea, they that tempt God are even delivered.
- [16] Then they that feared Yahweh spake often one to another: and Yahweh hearkened, and heard it, and a book of remembrance was written before him for them that feared Yahweh, and that thought upon his name.
- [17] And they shall be mine, saith Yahweh of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spareth his own son that serveth him.

[18] Then shall ye return, and discern between the righteous and the wicked, between him that serveth God and him that serveth him not.

#### Malachi 4

[1] For, behold, the day cometh, that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith Yahweh of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch.

Mark this in your Bibles. Underline it, circle it, highlight, whatever you do to show how important something is. If this has not happened, if Malachi 4:1 has not taken place - the Messiah has not come. If this is not fulfilled in Jesus, in Yeshua, in the first century, Jesus was not the Messiah.

For, behold, the day cometh, that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith Yahweh of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch.

[2] But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall.

[3] And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, saith Yahweh of hosts.

The jews say this has never happened. Had this happened in the first century, Jesus - well - I won't say that the jews would have accepted Jesus because no amount of fulfilled Bible prophecy ever out ther would convert a jew.

I told you earlier that I have spent a great deal of time this week listening to Tovia Singer videos. I guess I never really thought it all through completely until listening to so many of his videos. The jews in the first century rejected Jesus. They did not believe He was the Messiah. They killed Him because they said He was a blasphemer that thought Himself equal with God. They really thought they were doing God-service. The reality is they were truly of their father the devil. And the exact same thing needs to be said today. It is the same today with these people as it was back then. I simply cannot fathom for one second believing the same things these people believe.

Knowing what they believe - knowing that they say that Jesus was not the Messiah because He did not fulfill the prophecies - a l l of them - makes me all the more committed to finding EVERY SINGLE prophecy from the Old World - and finding that fulfillment in Jesus, in Yeshua the Christ that came in the first century.

In case you didn't know it already, I despise the teachings of the jews. I despise the teachings of the "church." They are one and the same. And the jews - who know their jewish bibles WAY MORE than the "churchians" know theirs - literally laugh at the ignorance of the "churchians" for saying the prophecies are not fulfilled. To say the prophecies are not fulfilled - is to say that Jesus was not the Messiah.

The jew doesn't care one bit if someone calls themself a so-called "christian" as long as that person is preaching the jews' religion. And that is exactly what fighting against Fulfilled Bible Prophecy is. It is fighting against the truth that Jesus, that Yeshua was the Messiah that came in the first century in fulfillment of ALL the prophecies.

So how could you possibly say that verse 3 of Malachi 4 was fulfilled in Christ? Go to Luke chapter 10. How could

And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, saith Yahweh of hosts.

How could that be fulfilled Bible prophecy? Verse 1, Luke 10.

[1] After these things the Lord appointed other seventy also, and sent them two and two before his face into every city and place, whither he himself would come.

[2] Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest.

[3] Go your ways: behold, I send you forth as lambs among wolves.

[4] Carry neither purse, nor scrip, nor shoes: and salute no man by the way.

[5] And into whatsoever house ye enter, first say, Peace be to this house.

[6] And if the son of peace be there, your peace shall rest upon it: if not, it shall turn to you again.

[7] And in the same house remain, eating and drinking such things as they give: for the labourer is worthy of his hire. Go not from house to house.

[8] And into whatsoever city ye enter, and they receive you, eat such things as are set before you:

[9] And heal the sick that are therein, and say unto them, The kingdom of God is come nigh unto you.

[10] But into whatsoever city ye enter, and they receive you not, go your ways out into the streets of the same, and say,

[11] Even the very dust of your city, which cleaveth on us, we do wipe off against you: notwithstanding be ye sure of this, that the kingdom of God is come nigh unto you.

[12] But I say unto you, that it shall be more tolerable in that day for Sodom, than for that city.

[13] Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works had been done in Tyre and Sidon, which have been done in you, they had a great while ago repented, sitting in sackcloth and ashes.

[14] But it shall be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment, than for you.

[15] And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted to heaven, shalt be thrust down to hell.

[16] He that heareth you heareth me; and he that despiseth you despiseth me; and he that despiseth me despiseth him that sent me.

Now watch this.

[17] And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through thy name.

[18] And He said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven.

That was in the first century, by the way.

[19] Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.

[20] Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven.

So, was Malachi 4:3 fulfilled or not? This is what I mean when I say that if a man does not believe the prophecies were fulfilled in Christ, that man is not born of God. Do you think Bible prophecy matters? You better believe it does. If you are listening to people that are telling you that the prophecies have not been fulfilled, you better find someone else to listen to. Back to Malachi chapter 4, verse 4. We're talking about the day of judgement. We're talking about the great and dreadful day of the Lord. If someone tells you that that day has not taken place - you better watch out.

[4] Remember ye the law of Moses my servant, which I commanded unto him in Horeb for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments.

[5] Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of Yahweh:

[6] And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse.

The jews say this has not happened. The jews say this is unfulfilled Bible prophecy but will be fulfilled when the Messianic age begins. When the Messiah comes, this will be fulfilled. I wish I could say that we have all memorized Malachi 3 and 4. Maybe that's a little much for us - but at least that we could remember some of the most important things. Well, it's all extremely important. Let's just remember how important Malachi 3 and 4 are. Let's remember that the jewish "rabbis" say these are not fulfilled. No way. Can't be. History tells us so. No way these were fulfilled in the first century.

Remember this.

1) Before the day of judgement, God will send Elijah to prepare the way.

2) Judgement will come suddenly to the temple.

3) Judgement will come like fire and it will leave neither root nor branch.

I ask you now. Has this been fulfilled? Please be very careful at how you answer. Your answer determines your salvation. Whosoever that believeth that Jesus the Christ, came in the flesh, is of God. Whosoever believeth not that Jesus the Christ, came in the flesh, is not of God.

If Malachi 3 and 4 is unfulfilled, then the Messiah is yet to come. Jesus that came in the flesh, in the first century, is not the Christ if Malachi 3 and 4 is unfulfilled.

Please turn to Matthew chapter 3. Let's read verses 1-3. Malachi 3:1, before the judgement, God will send Elijah. Malachi 3:1

[1] Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

Matthew 3:1-3

[1] In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea,

[2] And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

[3] For this is he that was spoken of by the prophet Esaias, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.

This isn't hard, is it? Pretty much word for word. Malachi's prophecy was almost word for word the same as Isaiah's. Listen, it doesn't matter what the jews say. It doesn't

matter what the “rabbi” says. We see the fulfillment of the Old Covenant prophets - and we know - that Jesus was the Messiah. The Jews have no hold on God. They have no hold on truth. The people in the first century - they knew the - horrible translation coming - stay with me - these men knew the “Jewish Bible.” These men knew the Old Covenant prophets and Moses - and they knew them better than Tovia Singer will ever know them - and they knew that Jesus, that Yeshua was the fulfillment of Ezekiel and Isaiah and Jeremiah and Malachi - because John the Baptist was the one that Isaiah and Malachi was talking about. Flip over to Matthew chapter 11. Let's read in verse 1. We are looking for the fulfillment of anything from Malachi 3 and 4 regarding Elijah being sent before judgement. Verse 1.

[1] And it came to pass, when Jesus had made an end of commanding his twelve disciples, he departed thence to teach and to preach in their cities.

[2] Now when John had heard in the prison the works of Christ, he sent two of his disciples,

[3] And said unto him, (John sent his disciples to Jesus) Art thou He that should come, or do we look for another?

[4] Jesus answered and said unto them, Go and shew John again those things which ye do hear and see:

[5] The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor have the gospel preached to them.

[6] And blessed is he, whosoever shall not be offended in Me.

For sake of time this morning, we'll not turn to the passages, but Jesus is telling John's disciples - when He said Go and shew John the things you hear and see. He's saying, Yes, John, I am the One fulfilling the prophecies. You know what the prophecies are. I am the One that was sent to fulfill them - ALL - A-L-L of them. Verse 7. Now please watch this closely. I have had more than one “preacher” tell me none of this means that John the Baptist fulfilled Malachi 3 and 4.

[7] And as they departed, Jesus began to say unto the multitudes concerning John, What went ye out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken with the wind?

Here Christ is talking about Isaiah 42.

[8] But what went ye out for to see? A man clothed in soft raiment? behold, they that wear soft clothing are in kings' houses.

[9] But what went ye out for to see? A prophet? yea, I say unto you, and more

than a prophet.

**[10]** For this is he, of whom it is written, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee.

Brethren, there can't be anything clearer than this. I know I say that a lot, but tell me, please, someone tell me how this is not word for word what Malachi prophesied in Malachi 3 and 4. If someone stands up and tells you that Malachi 3 and 4 have not been fulfilled, my goodness, can you really not see how that denies Jesus? Can you really not see how saying that Malachi 3 and 4 has not been fulfilled is calling Jesus, Yeshua the Christ the One Who came in the first century - how that's not calling Him a liar?

That is exactly what the jews do. A man that preaches or a man that believes the jews' religion is not born of God. Listen. I did not write the book. All I'm doing is reading just like everyone else has opportunity to do. If a man says that the prophecies were not fulfilled in Christ in the first century - then Jesus was not the Messiah. If Jesus was not the Messiah - that man is lost. I don't know how else to say it. Should I sugar coat it? Should I look over it? I'm telling you - and have been saying for almost 40 years now - to anyone and everyone who would give me 2 seconds to listen - if a man gets Bible prophecy wrong - he is not in Christ. If someone believes, as we are seeing today - if someone believes that Malachi 3 and 4 has not been fulfilled - that man is denying Christ. Then, oh my goodness, to say that we know that Bible prophecy is not fulfilled because of "history." Well, what is Matthew chapter 11? What history book do you prefer? But the "church fathers." Again, "church" is a dead give away for me - but what history book do you prefer. Give me the Bible. Just let me have the Bible. Yeah, I know, I know, men have tried to corrupt it, they've tried to change it - they even inserted the perverted word "church" - I know that - but we have the promise that the Holy Spirit of God would lead us into truth - when we submit to the present day reality of the King and His Kingdom. If we spend all our days trying to convince ourselves and everyone around us that the Kingdom hasn't come - because "history says this or history says that" - friends - people that have those beliefs may never come to the truth.

All - A-L-L Bible prophecy has been fulfilled because that's what the Bible says. Matthew 11:10 is almost word for word the prophecies of Malachi 3 and 4. I don't need or want a "history" book - other than the history book that is the Bible. Verse 11.

**[11]** Verily I say unto you, Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist: notwithstanding he that is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

**[12]** And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven

suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force.

**[13]** For all the prophets and the law prophesied until John.

Do you see what great significance there is in those Words of Christ? Listen friends, John the Baptist was hugely important in the timeline of the Messiah. To say that Malachi 3 and 4 is unfulfilled - that is total blasphemy. Better wake up. Better get serious about learning what the prophecies were and how they were fulfilled in the time of Jesus. Now verse 14 - the Words of Jesus, the Words of Yeshua in the first century.

**[14]** And if ye will receive it, this is Elias, which was for to come.

Is there any doubt in any one's mind this morning, that John the Baptist was the fulfillment of Malachi 3:1 and Malachi 4:1?

Go back to Malachi chapter 4, please. I believe, at least it better be, brethren, it better be clear to everyone listening that John the Baptist was the fulfillment of Malachi 3 and 4. If anyone listening today does not believe this, all I can say is, let us know, and we'll have everyone we know praying for you - because you are lost. If you do not believe that John the Baptist was the fulfillment of Malachi 3 and 4 - after everything we have read about him - then - I'm sorry - you're lost. Malachi chapter 4.

Look again at verse 1.

**[1]** For, behold, the day cometh, that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith Yahweh of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch.

The branches and the roots would be burned up - so prophecies Malachi. Has that day come? Go back to Matthew chapter 3, please. We have already established that John the Baptist was the preparer of the way from Malachi 3 and 4. Listen to what John said. Again, with verse 1:

**[1]** In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea,

**[2]** And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

**[3]** For this is he that was spoken of by the prophet Esaias, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. (Malachi said it a little bit differently, but it's still the same)

**[4]** And the same John had his raiment of camel's hair, and a leathern girdle about his loins; and his meat was locusts and wild honey.

**[5]** Then went out to him Jerusalem, and all Judaea, and all the region round about Jordan,

[6] And were baptized of him in Jordan, confessing their sins.

[7] But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees come to his baptism, he said unto them, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come?

Is not this the day of judgement coming? You better believe it is. And look again at who it was coming to. THAT GENERATION. Verse 8. This is Elijah the prophet, prophesied in the book of Malachi.

[8] Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance:

[9] And think not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to our father: for I say unto you, that God is able of these stones to raise up children unto Abraham.

[10] And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.

Friends, if you are truly a follower of Jesus the Christ, Yeshua the Christ of the first century, these verses should make you happy as can be. Seeing how these prophecies were fulfilled in Christ - many years after they were prophesied - is an awesome thing to see. This is faith. This is the system of believe once delivered to the saints. And this gives us hope that our faith is the true faith of God. The jews' religion is the false religion. The religion that does nothing but say that the prophecies are still to be fulfilled - wow - what a hopeless religion. What a hopeless faith. We have fulfilled prophecies. We see from the Word of God how the prophecies were fulfilled in Jesus - in the first century. We see why the true Christian faith - turned the world upside down - to the point where even still today - though most of the entire world has turned their backs on Jesus - still the whole world sets their dates on the most important century the world has ever known. There's a reason for it. It's because Jesus, Yeshua, the Messiah, the Saviour, the Redeemer and King came in the first century. And we know He is the Messiah - because He fulfilled the prophets - ALL - A-L-L of them.

John said, in his day, in the first century, as he was the prophet preparing the way of the Lord - John said - NOW - at that time -

the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.

That's nearly word for word fulfillment of Malachi 4:1. Praise God, that is awesome. Malachi said concerning those that refused to obey God - the great day of the Lord would come and that day would leave them neither root nor branch.

Friends, if a man does not believe that that day has come and gone - that man is lost. That man is not in Christ. He has denied that Jesus was the Christ. Turn to Matthew 23. We'll quickly try to read the entire chapter, verse 1. Looking for a day that would leave neither root nor branch.

- [1] Then spake Jesus to the multitude, and to his disciples,
- [2] Saying, The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat:
- [3] All therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do not ye after their works: for they say, and do not.
- [4] For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers.
- [5] But all their works they do for to be seen of men: they make broad their phylacteries, and enlarge the borders of their garments,
- [6] And love the uppermost rooms at feasts, and the chief seats in the synagogues,
- [7] And greetings in the markets, and to be called of men, Rabbi, Rabbi.
- [8] But be not ye called Rabbi: for one is your Master, even Christ; and all ye are brethren.
- [9] And call no man your father upon the earth: for one is your Father, which is in heaven.
- [10] Neither be ye called masters: for one is your Master, even Christ.
- [11] But he that is greatest among you shall be your servant.
- [12] And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.
- [13] But woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye shut up the kingdom of heaven against men: for ye neither go in yourselves, neither suffer ye them that are entering to go in.

Friends, I'm telling you. Be careful of voices that tell you that the Kingdom of God is not here yet. Be careful of voices that tell you the Kingdom is future. I'm telling you, futurism - in any shape or form - is a denial that Jesus is the Christ.

- [14] Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye devour widows' houses, and for a pretence make long prayer: therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation.

Judgements coming!

- [15] Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye compass sea and

land to make one proselyte, and when he is made, ye make him twofold more the child of hell than yourselves.

[16] Woe unto you, ye blind guides, which say, Whosoever shall swear by the temple, it is nothing; but whosoever shall swear by the gold of the temple, he is a debtor!

[17] Ye fools and blind: for whether is greater, the gold, or the temple that sanctifieth the gold?

[18] And, Whosoever shall swear by the altar, it is nothing; but whosoever sweareth by the gift that is upon it, he is guilty.

[19] Ye fools and blind: for whether is greater, the gift, or the altar that sanctifieth the gift?

[20] Whoso therefore shall swear by the altar, sweareth by it, and by all things thereon.

[21] And whoso shall swear by the temple, sweareth by it, and by him that dwelleth therein.

[22] And he that shall swear by heaven, sweareth by the throne of God, and by him that sitteth thereon.

[23] Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.

[24] Ye blind guides, which strain at a gnat, and swallow a camel.

[25] Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye make clean the outside of the cup and of the platter, but within they are full of extortion and excess.

[26] Thou blind Pharisee, cleanse first that which is within the cup and platter, that the outside of them may be clean also.

[27] Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are like unto whited sepulchres, which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness.

[28] Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and iniquity.

[29] Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! because ye build the tombs of the prophets, and garnish the sepulchres of the righteous,

[30] And say, If we had been in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets.

[31] Wherefore ye be witnesses unto yourselves, that ye are the children of them

which killed the prophets.

**[32]** Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers.

Do you hear what Jesus is saying to these people - in the first century.

Fill up the measure. You have filled it up to the top. It's overflowing. You've killed the prophets. You've refused to obey God. He says - "I've had it. My Father has had enough."

**[33]** Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell?

**[34]** Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall kill and crucify; and some of them shall ye scourge in your synagogues, and persecute them from city to city:

**[35]** That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the temple and the altar.

Now listen!

**[36]** Verily I say unto you, All these things shall come upon this generation.

Brethren, if a man comes along - I don't care if he's a jewish "rabbi" - or he's a lily white "churchian israel" - if that man tells you that the judgement promised - the great and dreadful day of the Lord - prophesied in Malachi 3 and 4 - if he tells you that day has not come - that man is preaching the jews' religion.

**[37]** O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!

Now listen!

**[38]** Behold, your house is left unto you desolate.

The day cometh that will leave neither root nor branch. That is exactly what Christ was saying. He was talking about the promised judgement from the book of Malachi. That's why Malachi said John the Baptist would start it all.

The “preacher” in the video was saying that because Rome wasn't destroyed at AD70 - rather it was Jerusalem - that because it wasn't Rome - then the first century didn't fulfill Malachi 3 and 4. That's a bit of a new one on me.

Friends, this is a book about Israel. To Israel. By Israelites and for Israelites. The judgement of Malachi 3 and 4 was to Israel. It was not to Rome. It was not to Babylon. It was to Israel. It was fulfilled in the first century and to say that it wasn't is to deny that Jesus, that Yeshua was the Messiah.

Understanding the prophets. Understanding the fulfillment of the prophets. This is absolutely a matter of salvation.

If you're still sitting on the fence, undecided. I challenge you. Go to youtube and watch as many Tovia Singer videos as you can find. The jews say that Jesus was not the Messiah because Jesus did not fulfill the prophecies - ALL - A-L-L the prophecies. And if that's what you want to believe - then know this - you believe the same thing the jews do. And, if you believe the jews' religion - whosoever believeth not that Jesus is the Christ - is not of God.

Faith, saving faith, is the faith once delivered to the saints. The first century saints knew that Jesus fulfilled the prophecies - ALL of them. This is why they were convinced, beyond any shadow of a doubt - that Jesus was the Messiah. And once they realized that Jesus was the Messiah - they knew that He was the King. And once they knew that He was the King -

These all do contrary to the decrees of Caesar, saying that there is another King, One Jesus.

And what did they do as a result of their faith?

These that have turned the world upside down.

Friends, we better be getting ready. We are in for the fight of our lives. If you think this vaccine garbage is going away - it isn't. It's just getting started with these people. We better make sure that we are standing on the Rock. We must have the power of the King in order to stand in these evil days. Those voices that are telling you that we are on the verge of a rapture or a second coming - I'm telling you - that's the jews' religion. He's already King. He's not coming back here again. We have our marching orders. They were delivered 2,000 years ago. And we better start living them.
