

Seventy Weeks of Daniel - To Make an End of Sins

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Good morning everyone. As always, thank you again for tuning in today's broadcast and for those of you listening to an archive, thank you also for taking time to listen to what I believe God has given me this week to share.

Last weekend, Teresa and I visited a Creation Museum just outside of Branson, Missouri because we had some time to kill while we were waiting on our youngest daughter.

The museum had a guided tour that lasted about 45 minutes or so and the tour guide was very nice and was most obviously devoted to her faith. She was kind - and so were we. There were several things that my wife and I made comments concerning to things in the museum - and the tour guide was kind in her responses back.

I had a feeling things might get interesting as at the very entrance to the museum, they had some space given to some of the infamous quotes from such Godly men as the largest whisky manufacturer on the east coast, a slave owner and adulterer who had sex with one of this 16 year old black slaves, a hedonist and a Muslim defender. And because these guys had some quotes where they mentioned the word "God" - we were supposed to have these warm and fuzzy feelings of endearment as if we owed these guys some special honor. Well, friends, I'm telling you that simply saying the word "God" isn't going to make the slightest impression on the God of heaven or His Son.

My Bible tells me that even the devils believe - and they tremble. You can identify those truly of the faith - or let me say you can begin to narrow down who those are that are truly of the faith - when they are not ashamed to speak and live in the name and authority of Jesus Christ - Yeshua the King. If that CONstitution was a Christian document - Christ would be in it. And He'd be more than just a date keeper.

As a follower of Christ, every word we say, every action we take, every breath we breathe, should be done to the glory of our King. I do not know any - not one - not one person who is a true follower of Christ that does not let me know it inside of brief period of time of conversation. You simply cannot know the King and go through life without sharing it.

Will we ever learn that politicians learned a long long time ago that in order for them to have any level of success - they have to appease the religious crowd? Don't misunderstand me - they'll never appease a true follower of the King - but they must

appease "churchianity" to gain acceptance among the masses. So, they'll say about anything the religious folk want to hear - in order to get their acceptance.

Then, when these same politicians are with another crowd, they'll say whatever that crowd wants to hear. I know that we are called sheep - but does that mean we're supposed to be stupid? I don't think so. I've not had much experience around sheep - as in the animal - but I've been told they are actually very intelligent. Apparently they have very good memory, recognition skills, they stick up for each other in fights - and may even know when one a member of their flock is being taken off for slaughter.

We aren't supposed to be stupid, but we sure fall for some of the craziest things.

I asked my Mom the other night - and as I was asking her - I just couldn't stop laughing. But I asked her if she remembered back in 1969, when Richard Nixon picked up his rotary dial phone in Washington, D.C. and called the Neil Armstrong on the moon for a conversation. I just couldn't stop laughing when I asked her if she really believed that Nixon called the moon from his office. I can't have a conversation on the most modern telephone today and be assured that the phone call will travel 25 miles - let alone 239,000 miles. Amazing.

Well, that might have been a little more than what some bargained for - but my point is if you are follower of Jesus Christ - Yeshua the Christ - your words, your actions, your life will show it.

Of course, I made a little comment to the young lady that was reminding us of the "Godly heritage of the U.S." I simply told her you had to go further back than 1787 if you wanted to see a Godly heritage on this soil. Sadly, very little is known about what took place on American soil back in the early 1600s. The truth of what took place was overshadowed by the Hollywood theatrics of what they called the Salem witch trials.

I've always - and I mean even when I was very young - but I've always had a problem calling people like George Washington and Thomas Jefferson - I've always had a problem calling them my "founding fathers." Listen, and I hope you get this and agree with me - as a follower of Christ - our founding fathers are Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Samuel, Elijah, David, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Peter, James, John the Baptist, John, Lazarus - those guys are our founding fathers. Those men were the founders of the commonwealth of Israel - with whom our citizenship is supposed to be in.

No where in that book are we told to be flag waving citizens of any country that is not

named the commonwealth of Israel. One of the gladdest days of my life was when I realized that we have a country. We are not stateless citizens - but we have a country - it's described as

a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:

[10] Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.

This is not some spiritual application that has no earthly value - this is who we are and what we are supposed to be doing.

But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels,

[23] To the general assembly and ecclesia of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect,

[24] And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel.

[25] See that ye refuse not him that speaketh. For if they escaped not who refused him that spake on earth, much more shall not we escape, if we turn away from him that speaketh from heaven:

[26] Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven.

[27] And this word, Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may remain.

[28] Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear:

[29] For our God is a consuming fire.

Do we believe this or not? Are these words just pie in the sky, good for heavenly talk without any earthly value?

We have a Kingdom that was given to us and we have a King that we are supposed to be serving. We have a country that we are supposed to be citizens of - but instead - like Esau - we have given away to satisfy temporal hunger in our bellies.

How long will continue this ridiculous idea that the governments that men have created

will save us if we can just get the right people elected? It hasn't worked for many years. It's not working now - but for some reason we are doing absolutely nothing to make change.

We continue to put our faith in people like Donald Trump - and people like Mike Pompeo - because these guys have thrown a bone out there attached with the word "God" every now and then.

Today is 4/28/2019. On the 17th of this month, or thereabout, secretary of state Mike Pompeo was speaking to a crowd at Texas A&M University. And this is what he said.

Is this funny? Is this something worth applause? Americans think it's a great thing that their government lies, cheats, steals - and kills. Friends I'm telling you that the people who think this is funny - and there is no doubt in my mind that the room had lots of "church-goers" in it - but if someone thinks this is funny - they are the enemy of God. For the people who think it was funny what Donald Trump said about all the women he had mistreated - they are enemies of God.

I'm sure that Peter had his shortcomings. I'm sure that Paul had his shortcomings. But I'll assure you they were not pedophiles and liars and thieves and rapists.

What I'm trying to tell you is that all around us - things have happened and continue to happen whereby God is telling His people to wake up. Come out from them and be separate and I will be your God - and you will be my people.

As we were concluding the trip to the creation museum, the curators had a final wall dedicated to quote unquote "leading people to Christ." They had a series of paintings on the wall - and the best I can recall - it started with the birth of Christ and went through various things in His life. I believe there were either 8 or 10 paintings. The last of the paintings was of Christ being crushed to the ground with the weight of the cross as He struggled to carry it.

I'm not sure why I had hoped for anything different - the museum proudly speaks of their 501(c)(3) government status - but my heart fell as I saw this was the last painting in the series.

The world - even the godless world - will acknowledge Jesus has a humiliated, beaten,

suffering, dying man hanging on a cross. The world - even the godless world - will celebrate His birth as He lay helpless in a manger as a little baby. But friends, telling the story of Jesus with paintings that end with His suffering under the cross - is NOT the Gospel. That message will not save you or anyone else. That is the message of "churchianity" and it is powerless to make change in people's lives. It is powerless to make change in our society.

The story of Jesus Christ does not end at the cross. I'm telling you today that the final picture should have been His Revelation to this world as the all-conquering, reigning King of kings and Lord of lords - and that coronation was held at AD70 - when the city and temple were so thoroughly laid to the ground that passersby never knew that it had been inhabited. That coronation occurred when the Old Covenant world - and all the elements thereof - burned up with fervent heat - when as the city was so totally consumed with fire that men said nothing like that had ever happened before - and surely would never happen again. Those events took place almost exactly 40 years from the time of Christ's prophecy when He said, "This generation shall not pass away till all these things be fulfilled."

I realize that if you have never heard this before - it comes as a shock. When you've been told all your life that "All these things shall come upon this generation" and "Verily I say unto you" didn't mean what Christ said - and "these be the days of vengeance when ALL things which are written in the prophets are fulfilled." When you've been told your whole life that those things didn't mean what they say - if you are told that enough - eventually you'll believe it. And even when such simple truths are set before you - you won't see it.

As I began witnessing to the lady at the museum, she said the verses I was quoting her were all taken out of context. But when I asked her about Matthew 24 - what was the context - she just couldn't see beyond what she had been programmed to believe.

What was the context? The first several verses tell us pretty clearly. His disciples - that's Peter, James, John - they came to Him and asked Him about the end of the world. Then the text says, Jesus showed them the buildings of the temple and said, "See ye not these things? There won't be one stone left here standing upon another that will not be thrown down."

Then what was the response of the disciples? "Tell us. When shall these things be. What shall be the sign of thy coming. And of the end of the world?"

They knew that the destruction of the temple would take place at His coming. Malachi said it - as plainly as it could be said.

[1] Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and Yahweh, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to this temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith Yahweh of hosts.

But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap:

[3] And he shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver: and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto Yahweh an offering in righteousness.

[4] Then shall the offering of Judah and Jerusalem be pleasant unto Yahweh, as in the days of old, and as in former years.

[5] And I will come near to you to judgment; and I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and against false swearers, and against those that oppress the hireling in his wages, the widow, and the fatherless, and that turn aside the stranger from his right, and fear not me, saith Yahweh of hosts.

[1] For, behold, the day cometh, that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith Yahweh of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch.

[2] But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall.

[3] And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, saith Yahweh of hosts.

[4] Remember ye the law of Moses my servant, which I commanded unto him in Horeb for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments.

[5] Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of Yahweh:

[6] And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse.

So they knew that when the temple would be destroyed, it would be at His coming. They knew this would be the end of the Old covenant world.

[15] For, behold, Yahweh will come with fire, and with his chariots like a whirlwind, to render his anger with fury, and his rebuke with flames of fire.

[16] For by fire and by his sword will Yahweh plead with all flesh: and the slain of Yahweh shall be many.

[17] They that sanctify themselves, and purify themselves in the gardens behind one tree in the midst, eating swine's flesh, and the abomination, and the mouse, shall be consumed together, saith Yahweh.

[18] For I know their works and their thoughts: it shall come, that I will gather all nations and tongues; and they shall come, and see my glory.

[19] And I will set a sign among them, and I will send those that escape of them unto the nations, to Tarshish, Pul, and Lud, that draw the bow, to Tubal, and Javan, to the isles afar off, that have not heard my fame, neither have seen my glory; and they shall declare my glory among the Gentiles.

[20] And they shall bring all your brethren for an offering unto Yahweh out of all nations upon horses, and in chariots, and in litters, and upon mules, and upon swift beasts, to my holy mountain Jerusalem, saith Yahweh, as the children of Israel bring an offering in a clean vessel into the house of Yahweh.

[21] And I will also take of them for priests and for Levites, saith Yahweh.

[22] For as the new heavens and the new earth, which I will make, shall remain before me, saith Yahweh, so shall your seed and your name remain.

[23] And it shall come to pass, that from one new moon to another, and from one sabbath to another, shall all flesh come to worship before me, saith Yahweh.

[24] And they shall go forth, and look upon the carcasses of the men that have transgressed against me: for their worm shall not die, neither shall their fire be quenched; and they shall be an abhorring unto all flesh.

Then, as Christ began to go into greater detail, in the context of Matthew 24:1-3 Christ tells His disciples - over and over and over - when You shall see this...when You shall see that...

When ye therefore shall see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place, (whoso readeth, let him understand:)

Then if any man shall say unto you, Lo, here is Christ, or there; believe it not.

[24] For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect.

[25] Behold, I have told you before.

[26] Wherefore if they shall say unto you, Behold, he is in the desert; go not forth: behold, he is in the secret chambers; believe it not.

[27] For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

[28] For wheresoever the carcase is, there will the eagles be gathered together.

[29] Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken:

[30] And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory.

[31] And he shall send his angels with a great sound of a trumpet, and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

[32] Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When his branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer is nigh:

[33] So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, even at the doors.

[34] Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled.

That is context. Jesus said to His disciples - over 2,000 years ago. You have to add to the Word of God to make it say that He was not telling His disciples that THEY would see all those things. I'm not the one taking the text out of context.

We have been deceived by politicians. We've been deceived by the minions of the politicians. As we were walking through the creation museum, we saw, almost everywhere we looked, the NASA symbol. Yes. The one that clearly has the red-forked tongue in the middle of it. Friends, listen, if you get your information on the origins of the world from NASA - you've got a big problem. But, Charlie, on their way to the moon they quoted a Bible verse. Yeah, and when they are talking to other people - they are telling people they believe the world was created by the big bang 4.5 billion years ago. At the least, it's called double-mindedness - and at the worst - it's purposeful deception. If you look to NASA to affirm the Word of God - I mean, what in the world are we as Christians doing?

NASA teaches the origins of the world occurred with a big bang. They do not believe that In the beginning, God created the heaven and the earth.

The so-called "preachers" in America are 501(c)(3) government approved and they have been telling people for as long as I've been alive that Matthew 24 is talking about thousands of years from the time Christ spoke the words. Who are we listening to? And where do they get the authority to say what they say? We as followers of Christ are not to have fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness. But rather, we are supposed to

reprove them.

It's hard to take, I know it is. But if you are listening to so-called "preachers" that have not come out from the governments of this world - by their own perspective of things - they cannot teach the whole counsel of God. If they are stopping at the cross - and teaching that Christ someday will be a King - or that He is merely a spiritual King today who will someday come again - by their own perspective of things - they cannot teach the truth concerning the present-day reality of the Kingdom of God.

I listened to this sweet lady tell me about the coming of Christ and the 1,000 year millennial reign. And all I could think about was the fact that her understanding is that the Laws of God have been done away with. Jesus put an end to the Laws of God at the cross.

In this supposed 1,000 millennial reign on earth, if Jesus was truly to come again and set up His Kingdom - what Laws would He use? He did away with God's Laws. Those bad Laws needed to be replaced - so He did that. Would He just make sure that the quote unquote "original intent of the U.S. CONstitution" would be enforced all over the world?

The deception that the Kingdom of God, His King, and His Laws are not for today is so thorough it's almost breathtaking.

How Christians can be so deceived to think that Barack Obama, or Richard Nixon, or John Kennedy, or Joseph Stalin, or Lenin, or Roosevelt, or Idi Amin, or Saddam Hussein, or Trump, or Pelosi, or Schumer, or Barney Frank, that these people are the ministers of God to thee for good is just too weird.

I look at the passages such as Romans 13 and I see "ordained of God" "ministers of God" "punish evil and praise good" - and I clearly look at those in men's governments in the world and can see they don't fit the description.

Then, I am reminded of how "churchianity" has twisted that passage into making people believe that Joseph Stalin, or Mao TseTung was God's minister and as they were mercilessly killing people - some of those people were just willing participants because these men are just doing the work of God.

But anyway, I received an email this week from a man who reminded me that God had put Nebuchadnezzar in his place. And how evil Nebuchadnezzar was and yet God put

him there just like he puts people in government places today.

I responded kindly, haven't got a reply, but I responded that the disparaging of Nebuchadnezzar like that has no foundation in Scripture. Absolutely, at the beginning of Nebuchadnezzar's kingdom, there's no telling what kind of egotistical maniac he was. But after he tried to murder Hananiah, Azariah and Mishrael - and he saw that Yahweh had saved them - he actually had the brains to realize he had met his match and what did he do? He exalted Daniel to number 1 in his kingdom over all his affairs.

So what did Daniel do? Come on. It doesn't take a lot of reason to figure out what Daniel did. Whose Laws do you think Daniel implemented while he was in Babylon. If Nebuchadnezzar was such a horrible bad guy, do you think Daniel used his position as number one in the kingdom to rule with evil laws? Of course not. Daniel instituted the Laws of God in Babylon and that's why Babylon prospered the way it did.

Now, even after all this, did Nebuchadnezzar fall? Sure did. Because Nebuchadnezzar did not have a personal relationship with Yahweh, he let some evil men talk him into thinking that his kingdom had become great because of himself. Yahweh fixed that for him and good. At the end of Nebuchadnezzar's days - and I believe that Nebuchadnezzar is with the Father today - this is what Nebuchadnezzar had to say:

[34] And at the end of the days I Nebuchadnezzar lifted up mine eyes unto heaven, and mine understanding returned unto me, and I blessed the most High, and I praised and honoured him that liveth for ever, whose dominion is an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom is from generation to generation:

[35] And all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: and he doeth according to his will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou?

[36] At the same time my reason returned unto me; and for the glory of my kingdom, mine honour and brightness returned unto me; and my counsellors and my lords sought unto me; and I was established in my kingdom, and excellent majesty was added unto me.

[37] Now I Nebuchadnezzar praise and extol and honour the King of heaven, all whose works are truth, and his ways judgment: and those that walk in pride he is able to abase.

Now, that happened in the Old Covenant World when Yahweh allowed the nations to walk in their own ways. Today, I see no government anywhere, where one of Yahweh's ministers is in place to administer the Laws of God and those Laws and Judgements are

being followed. So using Nebuchadnezzar as an example for following men's governments today is without foundation at the most - and total folly at the greatest.

In the New Covenant World - men are no longer allowed to set up their own governments. Those days are over. There is One Government and One King that is duly ordained of God. That is Jesus Christ - Yeshua the King. And He is not a foul-mouthed, lying, stealing, cheating, arrogant God hating miscreant. He does not build up statues whereby He pillages the people, steals their wealth, sends their sons and daughters off to fight oil wars or supposed terrorist hiding in caves in the mountains of Afghanistan.

Quote unquote "governments" that are in place in the world today - are in place not because God put them there. They are not there because God has ordained it to be so. They are there because they live in rebellion to the King of kings and Lord of lords and the people allow it because they have rebelled against the God of Heaven and prefer their ways, their laws, their treaties which shall be made in agreement thereof - instead of the simplicity of the Gospel of the Kingdom of God.

In this supposed 1,000 year millennial reign of Christ - what will be the currency? Will there be federal reserve banks with paper money and credit cards and Apple Pay and bitcoin? Friends, for the 99% of people out there who call themselves Christians today, they really should not hope for this 1,000 year millennial reign of Christ to come too soon, because if it were to come, every single one of us would be guilty of capital crimes because of the economic system we have built and we have allowed to be implemented in our society.

Because we have believed the lie that He is a coming King - because we have believed the lie that God's Laws have been done away with - we have traded the crown for cross - when the truth is - we should have traded the cross for crown. Friends, if He is not Lord, if He is not King, He is not saviour. Every single prophecy that was ever made in the Word of God was for the ultimate purpose of the establishment of the Kingdom and the revealing of the King.

We've got to come to grips with the understanding that the deceptions we have been bombarded with - all of them - from the spiritual - to the political - to the economic - all the deceptions have been for the purpose of making us believe that the Kingdom of God is not for today. The governments of this world will let you say all day long that He is a coming king. That's fine. You can say that all you want. But, if you dare to say - or dare to live - that He is King right now - I'll assure you that their tune will change quickly.

If there was a 1,000 year millennial reign of Christ on this earth - do you think there would be a tax on a man's labor? Knowing all that we have seen from the Word of God - how He has revealed His Perfect Will to us - do you really think there would be a tax on labor?

This is one of many reasons why the Kingdom of God must be taught as future. If the Kingdom is future, then man's laws are for today - and God has ordained it to be so. You may not buy into that philosophy - and I hope you don't - but those of us who do not believe that way are in the great great minority today.

We've been talking about the book of Daniel and I am going to say this again today - if someone does not believe that the book of Daniel has already been fulfilled - they cannot believe that Jesus / Yeshua was the Messiah. The book of Daniel is probably the most twisted prophecies of all of them in order to make people believe that the Kingdom of God is not for today.

If someone does not believe that the 70 weeks of Daniel 9:24 were not fulfilled in Jesus - in Yeshua in the first century - then the Kingdom of God has no chance to be understood.

Last week we skipped ahead to "reconciliation for iniquity." I told you this week we'd be going back to "make an end of sins."

Did Jesus - did Yeshua - "make an end of sins?" The great majority of quote unquote "Christians" will answer "not yet." They will then backtrack a little and make reference to the cross - but most will not readily agree that this aspect of Daniel 9:24 has already been fulfilled.

Daniel 9:24:

Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy.

Again, I believe that someone must add to the Word of God to conclude that there are thousands of years between the first week and the 70th week in this verse. One cannot take this verse and the surrounding verses and passages - and say that there are

thousands of years between the first and the 70th. Yet, that is exactly what "churchianity" has done. And it has done this because "churchianity" is an extension of the state. It is "churchianity" from the power of the state is derived.

In my own experience, I have seen cops and prosecutors as being terrorists. Bursting into the bedrooms of my children was terrorism. They act this way because "churchianity" has told them it is good for them to be terrorists. God has ordained you to be a terrorist. What they do today is not much different from when our Lord told His disciples that they would kill some of them and say they are doing God-service in doing so.

This is why I said a few weeks ago, we as true followers of Christ, MUST stop referring to these people as the "powers that be." The "powers that be" is a holy designation that belongs only to those who are implementing the Kingdom of God on earth - the same way as it is in heaven. And I'll assure you that the statues of men are not the Laws in heaven.

During the 70 weeks of Daniel, Messiah would put an end to sins. Friends, this is Fulfilled Bible Prophecy. Christ put an end to sins - in exact fulfillment of this prophecy and He did it over 2,000 years ago. Look with me please to what, as you already know, may be my favorite passage. Look with me to Hebrews 9:

In this great chapter, the writer is trying to explain to these people of the first century the dramatic change that Jesus Christ had caused to happen. This changing of the Covenant and the administration of it, was so drastic, so radical, that the Word of God describes it as New Heavens and a New Earth. A New Jerusalem. A new covenant. Verse 19.

[19] For when Moses had spoken every precept to all the people according to the law, he took the blood of calves and of goats, with water, and scarlet wool, and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book, and all the people,

[20] Saying, This is the blood of the testament which God hath enjoined unto you.

[21] Moreover he sprinkled with blood both the tabernacle, and all the vessels of the ministry.

[22] And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission.

[23] It was therefore necessary that the patterns of things in the heavens should be purified with these; but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices

than these.

[24] For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us:

[25] Nor yet that he should offer himself often, as the high priest entereth into the holy place every year with blood of others;

[26] For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

As I have so many times before, I ask you again today - when does this verse of Scripture say that Christ sacrificed Himself? Come on, now. It simply cannot get any clearer than this. And what did He do in the end of the world?

...but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

[27] And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:

[28] So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.

Does this passage of Scripture fulfill Daniel 9:24? I hope you are seeing this. If Daniel 9:24 has not already been fulfilled, then Jesus / Yeshua was not the Messiah.

Let's continue on with Hebrews 10, beginning in verse 1:

[1] For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect.

Now let's make a very clear distinction here. What Law is begin talked about here? This is the Law of Sacrifices. This is the sacrificial system of the Old Covenant World. We are not talking about the Laws and Judgements of God that should be implemented in our society for justice. Verse 2.

[2] For then would they not have ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins.

[3] But in those sacrifices there is a remembrance again made of sins every year.

[4] For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away

sins.

[5] Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me:

[6] In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin thou hast had no pleasure.

[7] Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me,) to do thy will, O God.

[8] Above when he said, Sacrifice and offering and burnt offerings and offering for sin thou wouldest not, neither hadst pleasure therein; which are offered by the law;

[9] Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second.

[10] By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

[11] And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins:

The Old Covenant World's sacrificial system - by the Scripture's own testimony - never took away sins.

[12] But this man,

Which man? This man, Jesus / Yeshua. This man

after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God;

Please please meditate on this passage of Scripture. Study it. If you cannot see the fulfillment of Daniel 9:24 right here - in Christ - over 2,000 years ago - then I don't know what else can be said to show you. Verse 13:

[13] From henceforth expecting till his enemies be made his footstool.

[14] For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified.

[15] Whereof the Holy Ghost also is a witness to us: for after that he had said before,

Now watch this carefully, prayerfully, as closely as you can.

[16] This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them;

[17] And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more.

Which covenant is He talking about? Is this the New Covenant? Absolutely. And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more.

Surely you will have to say, yes, I see that Daniel 9:24, to make an end of sins, to make reconciliation for iniquity, yes, I see that fulfillment right here in Hebrews 9 and 10.

Now let's back track a little and go back to Hebrews chapter 8 and we'll read from verse 1.

[1] Now of the things which we have spoken this is the sum: We have such an high priest, who is set on the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens;

[2] A minister of the sanctuary, and of the true tabernacle, which the Lord pitched, and not man.

[3] For every high priest is ordained to offer gifts and sacrifices: wherefore it is of necessity that this man have somewhat also to offer.

[4] For if he were on earth, he should not be a priest, seeing that there are priests that offer gifts according to the law:

[5] Who serve unto the example and shadow of heavenly things, as Moses was admonished of God when he was about to make the tabernacle: for, See, saith he, that thou make all things according to the pattern shewed to thee in the mount.

[6] But now hath he obtained a more excellent ministry, by how much also he is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises.

[7] For if that first covenant had been faultless, then should no place have been sought for the second.

[8] For finding fault with them, he saith, Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah:

[9] Not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day when I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt; because they continued not in my covenant, and I regarded them not, saith the Lord.

[10] For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, and write them in their hearts: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people:

[11] And they shall not teach every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the Lord: for all shall know me, from the least to the

greatest.

[12] For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more.

Is this the fulfillment of Daniel 9:24? Am I taking all these texts out of context? Hardly. Come on. I'm offering one proof text after another. Yeshua was the Messiah. He is now the King, His Kingdom is now, it is the responsibility of every living, breathing creature to conform to His Kingdom now, and it is so because He fulfilled ALL the prophecies. He fulfilled Daniel 9:24 - and He is King and His Kingdom is Now.

[13] In that he saith, A new covenant, he hath made the first old. Now that which decayeth and waxeth old is ready to vanish away.

I had someone ask me not long ago about verse 11 - for all shall know me. Doesn't that seem like a future fulfillment? Go with me to John 6: and let's begin reading in verse 26

[26] Jesus answered them and said, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Ye seek me, not because ye saw the miracles, but because ye did eat of the loaves, and were filled.

[27] Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed.

[28] Then said they unto him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?

[29] Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent.

[30] They said therefore unto him, What sign shewest thou then, that we may see, and believe thee? what dost thou work?

[31] Our fathers did eat manna in the desert; as it is written, He gave them bread from heaven to eat.

[32] Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven.

[33] For the bread of God is he which cometh down from heaven, and giveth life unto the world.

[34] Then said they unto him, Lord, evermore give us this bread.

[35] And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.

[36] But I said unto you, That ye also have seen me, and believe not.

[37] All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I

will in no wise cast out.

[38] For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me.

[39] And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day.

[40] And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day.

[41] The Jews then murmured at him, because he said, I am the bread which came down from heaven.

[42] And they said, Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? how is it then that he saith, I came down from heaven?

[43] Jesus therefore answered and said unto them, Murmur not among yourselves.

[44] No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day.

[45] It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me.

Is this proof text from what we just read in the book of Hebrews?

[46] Not that any man hath seen the Father, save he which is of God, he hath seen the Father.

[47] Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life.

[48] I am that bread of life.

[49] Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead.

[50] This is the bread which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die.

[51] I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world.

Over and over and over, we see the prophecies fulfilled in Christ, when He walked on this earth over 2,000 years ago. This is why He said, to those people hearing His voice, over 2,000 years ago, "For these be the days of vengeance, when ALL things written in the prophets are fulfilled."
